ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS: The process in which adults enter the Roman Catholic Church is known as OCIA, "The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults." Who is eligible for this process?

<u>The Unbaptized.</u> The primary focus of the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults is on those who are not already Christian and have had little or no religious education.

<u>Baptized but un-catechized</u> are those who have been baptized in the <u>Roman Catholic Church</u> but need further catechetical instruction to celebrate the <u>Sacraments of Reconciliation</u>, <u>Confirmation</u>, and the <u>Holy Eucharist</u>.

Those Seeking Full Communion with the Catholic Church are baptized, practicing Christians from another Christian Tradition who seek entry, or full communion with the Roman Catholic Church.

AROUND US

LITURGICAL CALENDAR FOR OCTOBER: October falls during the liturgical season known as <u>Ordinary Time</u>, which is represented by the liturgical color green. The month of **October** is dedicated to the **Holy Rosary**.

HOLY FATHER: You are invited to pray for the Holy Father's October intention: We pray that the Church continue to sustain in all ways a Synodal lifestyle, as a sign of co-responsibility, promoting the participation, the communion and the mission shared among priests, religious and lay people.

RESPECT LIFE MONTH: Every October, we consider more deeply why *every* human life is valuable and reflect on how to build a culture that protects life from conception to natural death. This year's focus is on radical solidarity with women who are pregnant or raising children in difficult circumstances: O God, source of all life and goodness, You fashion human lives in Your image and likeness, and through Your love, give each human life dignity, sacredness, and priceless worth; awaken in every heart new reverence for the least of Your children, and renew among your people a readiness to nurture and sustain Your precious gift of human life at all stages, and in all conditions. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son, who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

CATHOLIC TEACHING: PREFERENTIAL OPTION FOR THE POOR: A phrase reminding us that justice and concern for the poor are urgently mandated throughout the Bible. The church's love for the poor is inspired by the Gospel Beatitudes, by the poverty of Jesus, and by His concern for the disadvantaged and oppressed. It's also mandated in the final judgment parable, when the only agenda item is: "What you did for the least of these, You did for me." Where do migrants and refugees belong? It's a political question with a biblical answer: right here with the rest of us. Since 1914 the church has observed a day to assist the "family in migration and the challenges it faces," as Pope John Paul II phrased it: And he urged us to commit to overcoming "all racism, xenophobia, and exaggerated nationalism" that affects our relationship to displaced persons.

In teaching us charity, the Gospel instructs us in the preferential respect due to the poor and the special situation they have in society.

WHY IT MATTERS

We all have a unique summons to become one with God. Some **mystics** are seers or visionaries. Others are poets, sages, or storytellers. Becoming better acquainted with the stories of holy **mystics** might enable us to locate our own spiritual calling.

From the Catechism of the Catholic Church: "Spiritual progress tends toward ever more intimate union with Christ. This union is called 'mystical' because it participates in the mystery of Christ through the sacraments—the holy mysteries—and the mystery of the Holy Trinity. God calls us all to this intimate union, even if the special graces or extraordinary signs of this mystical life are granted only to some for the sake of manifesting the gratuitous gift given to all."

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

What are visions?

Visions are a product of God's self-communication.
Christianity is grounded in divine revelation so the leap to visions isn't as great as it seems. Nonetheless visions are extraordinary events. Tangible visions are rare. Juan Diego got the tilma cloak from Our Lady of Guadalupe. A globe of fire entered Philip Neri's chest, enlarging his heart and breaking his ribs. Francis of Assisi endured stigmata.

Mystics agree the most reliable visions are intellectual or intuitive, less likely distorted by unreliable senses. Mystics also insist having visions isn't the goal. Most mystics have early visions before moving into greater communion with God. The vision merely provided a boost into something richer. The church leaves belief in specific visions open to question. If we paid more attention, though, all of us might see more than we expect.

MEMORIAL OF TERESA OF JESUS (ÁVILA), DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH (OCTOBER 15)

Seek some mystic reform

Saint Teresa of Ávila, also known as Teresa of Jesus, one of the spiritual greats of the church, entered the cloister in the early 1500s and had a seemingly routine life on the surface. But as her **mystical** encounters with Jesus emerged, along with her desire for a simpler, less worldly way of being, she began to write about the spiritual life and advocated for reform of her religious order, against strong opposition. Declared a doctor of the church, Teresa's reforms and enduring spiritual insights still carry weight.


