**MATRIMONY/MATRIMONIO:** Arrangements should be made at least six or more months in advance. A marriage preparation program is required.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK/INFERMI: In cases of emergencies, please call anytime. Please notify the Parish Office for Communion calls to the sick, shut-ins. Due to privacy laws, if parishioners wish to be visited in the hospital, they should contact the Parish Office directly and give the information regarding the hospitalization. If you are scheduled for surgeries or other medical procedures, please contact the Parish Office in advance so that a priest can administer Anointing of the Sick prior to the procedure.

# Dear Friends in Christ,

Today begins the **Advent** season. It's time to prepare for the **Feast of the Nativity of the Lord**. We might want to take advantage of Adoration on **Thursday** at **Sacred Heart** or, at least, maybe add an extra **15 minutes** to our daily prayer to help remind ourselves of the great gift of the presence of the living **God** among us and in gratitude for our redemption. It's all too easy to drift into the commercial mindset that the season is all about food, presents and parties!

You might notice that the new doors have been installed. This was paid for by the **Paver Account** and has been long overdue. The wooden doors were rotting on the inside and the mechanisms were completely worn out. These new doors should last us another hundred years!

The final tallies for the Festival are done. Here are the results: We budgeted a gross intake of \$682,400.00 -

Actual income - \$712,172.20.

We budgeted expenses of \$484,480.00 – Actual expenses - \$475,810.23.

Our profit was budgeted for \$207,920.00 – Our actual profit was \$237,882.23.

It is an interesting fact that since **2002** our Festival has generated **\$8,204,575.86** and we have seen a profit of **\$2,723,290.07**. This income has helped us keep our parish facility in excellent condition and has enabled much of our activity. Gratitude for those who make this happen is hardly able to be adequately expressed. Thank you to the whole parish, to those who volunteer untold hours and hard work to make this happen, to **Adam's** management and to all who **attend! Many Blessings**.

Finally - The owner of the two lots at the end of Hamlet Street has decided to sell those lots. Mr. Schilling has generously allowed us to use that property for the **Festival** – the area with the rides and children's activity. To protect the Festival and our accessibility to parking, St. John's has purchased those two lots. The funds to do so were provided by the dormant Café Account and the residue from the Festival. The deal was negotiated by the Diocesan Real Estate Office and the contract signed by **Bishop Fernandes**. Per the corporate structure of the Catholic Church, the Bishop owns all diocesan property, but it remains an asset of the local parish. Were we ever to sell it, the money would be ours. The price was \$490,000, \$350,000 of that came from the liquidation of the Café Fund, a fund that held the insurance payments for the cafe that we owned on the corner of Lincoln and 4th and that burned several years ago.



**ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS:** The process in which adults enter the **Roman Catholic Church** is known as **OCIA**, "**The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults.**" Who is eligible for this process?

<u>The Unbaptized.</u> The primary focus of the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults is on those who are not already Christian and have had little or no religious education.

**Baptized but un-catechized** are those who have been baptized in the **Roman Catholic Church** but need further catechetical instruction to celebrate the **Sacraments of Reconciliation, Confirmation**, and the **Holy Eucharist**.

Those Seeking Full Communion with the Catholic Church are baptized, practicing Christians from another Christian Tradition who seek entry, or full communion with the Roman Catholic Church.

WELCOME TO ADVENT: For Catholics, the new Liturgical Year commences today with the First Sunday of Advent, opening the

Advent season. In this new Liturgical Year, the Church not only wishes to indicate the beginning of a period, but the beginning of a renewed commitment to the faith by all those who follow Christ. This is a time of prayer and penance. The entire Liturgy of the Advent season spurs us to an awakening in our Christian life and will put us in a "vigilant" disposition, to wait for Our Lord Jesus who is coming. The 1st Sunday of Advent symbolizes Hope with the "Prophet's Candle" reminding us that Jesus is coming.

THE SOLEMNITY OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION, DECEMBER 9: On December 9, we honor Mary, our Mother. The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception is a Catholic feast and Holy Day of Obligation celebrating Mary's conception without sin. Even though this feast day occurs in the liturgical season of Advent, which prepares for the birth of Our Lord Jesus Christ, the Immaculate Conception refers to the conception of Mary in the womb of her mother, St. Anne. The dogma of the Immaculate Conception asserts that, "from the first moment of her conception, the Blessed Virgin Mary was, by the singular grace and privilege of Almighty God, and in view of the merits of Jesus Christ, Savior of Mankind, kept free from all stain of original sin."



PRAYER: Grant Your faithful, we pray, almighty God, the resolve to run forth to meet Your Christ with righteous deeds at His coming, so that, gathered at His right hand, they may be worthy to possess the

heavenly Kingdom. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son, who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen
