**PARISH MEMBERSHIP:** We welcome you into our Parish Families. Membership in the parish consists of two parts:

Registration: Please fill out form and return to Office.

**Participation:** As a member of the Church, you are accepting the responsibility of weekly worship as well as supporting God's work here through giving of yourself, your time and talents, and a worthy Sunday offering to show your love for God and your gratitude for His many favors.

**RECONCILIATION/CONFESSIONE:** One half-hour prior to weekend Mass or by request/appointment.

**BAPTISM/BATTESIMO:** Preparation is required for the reception of the sacrament. Parents are encouraged to call the Rectory and set up an appointment before the birth of their child.

**MATRIMONY/MATRIMONIO:** Arrangements should be made at least six or more months in advance. A marriage preparation program is required.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK/INFERMI: In cases of emergencies, please call anytime. Please notify the Parish Office for Communion calls to the sick, shut-ins. Due to privacy laws, if parishioners wish to be visited in the hospital, they should contact the Parish Office directly and give the information regarding the hospitalization. If you are scheduled for surgeries or other medical procedures, please contact the Parish Office in advance so that a priest can administer Anointing of the Sick prior to the procedure.

### Dear Friends in Christ,

We are into the second week of **Advent** and the Feast of the **Nativity of the Lord** is only a few weeks away. I encourage everyone to make some kind of extra effort to prepare for the celebration of the Birth of the Savior. We have the unique opportunity at **Sacred Heart** to spend time with the **Lord** every **Thursday** at **Adoration** from **10:00 a.m. to 6:30 p.m.** with **Mass** at **6:30 p.m.** followed by Confessions and continued Adoration with Benediction until **7:30 p.m.** 

Because this is the Jubilee Year of the Sacred Heart, a person can gain a Plenary Indulgence by visiting any church dedicated to the Sacred Heart, going to Mass and Confession, and praying for the intention of the Holy Father. One can do all that any Thursday here at Sacred Heart. This might be a great way to prepare ourselves for the Christmas Feast.

The Christmas Season is a time of generosity. Giving to someone in need, giving to your parish church which is in need and being especially sensitive to those you encounter on the streets may be a good way of showing to others an open heart. We do a lot at St. John's – the Giving Tree is only one way to reach out to others. I recall as a 1st grader going to my mother with the perennial question a child asks about Santa Claus – she answered me "Yes, it is what we call the spirit of generosity at Christmas Time." I got another good year out of that answer with no dishonesty involved at all. We could engage more deeply in the Santa (Saint) spirit as well, not only materially, but also spiritually, by praying for others, especially those in greatest need of God's goodness and mercy.

**ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS:** The process in which adults enter the **Roman Catholic Church** is known as **OCIA**, "**The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults.**" Who is eligible for this process?

<u>The Unbaptized.</u> The primary focus of the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults is on those who are not already Christian and have had little or no religious education.

**Baptized but un-catechized** are those who have been baptized in the **Roman Catholic Church** but need further catechetical instruction to celebrate the **Sacraments of Reconciliation, Confirmation**, and the **Holy Eucharist**.

Those Seeking Full Communion with the Catholic Church are baptized, practicing Christians from another Christian Tradition who seek entry, or full communion with the Roman Catholic Church.

DECEMBER 12: FEAST DAY OF OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE: In the USA, the Church celebrates the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Our Lady appeared to a Native American convert named Juan Diego on December 9, 1531. She left a marvelous portrait of herself on the mantle of Juan Diego. This miraculous image has proved to be ageless and is kept in the shrine built in her honor, the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe. In 1910, Our Lady of Guadalupe was declared Patroness of Latin America, and in 1945, Pope Pius XII declared Her to be the Empress of all the Americas. THE SOLEMNITY OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION, DECEMBER 9: On December 9, we honor Mary, our mother. The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception is a Catholic Feast and Holy Day of Obligation celebrating Mary's conception without sin. Even though this Feast day occurs in the liturgical season of Advent, which prepares for the birth of Our Lord Jesus Christ, the Immaculate Conception refers to the conception of Mary in the womb of her mother, St. Anne. The dogma of the Immaculate Conception asserts that, *"from the first moment of her conception, the Blessed Virgin Mary was, by the singular grace and privilege of Almighty God, and in view of the merits of Jesus Christ, Savior of Mankind, kept free from all stain of original sin."* 



THE SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT: Today, we celebrate by Lighting the Bethlehem candle: A purple candle is lit to represent the hope of Christ coming to the world. Focusing on peace: Peace is a central theme of Advent, and the Second Sunday of Advent focuses on it in particular. Hearing the message of John the Baptist: The Gospel for the Second Sunday of Advent features John the Baptist and his message of repentance. Preparing the way of the Lord: During Advent, people affirm John's message by preparing the way of the Lord in their own lives.

"Here is a good program for #Advent: to encounter Jesus coming in every brother and sister who needs us and to share with them what we can: listening, time, concrete assistance." @Pontifex
