Due to privacy laws, if parishioners wish to be visited in the hospital, they should contact the Parish Office directly and give the information regarding the hospitalization. On the occasion of Jesus feeding 5,000 people with one boy's lunch, there was enough for leftovers. And when Jesus turned water into wine, it was a *lot* of wine, and the best kind, too. #### The Promised Land is on the horizon

Martin Luther King Jr. promised that the nation would "get to the Promised Land" on racial equality someday. In his election night speech, President Barack Obama spoke of 106-year-old voter Ann Nixon Cooper: "She was born just a generation past slavery; a time . . . when someone like her couldn't vote for two reasons because she was a woman and because of the color of her skin." As we celebrate Christian Unity Week, we acknowledge that while we still have much work to do in overcoming divisions in our nation and establishing Christ's peace, each of us can take steps toward the Promised Land by calling out the sin of racism.

## Tuesday, Jan 21, 2025

#### Enjoy a laugh

Today is National One-Liners Day, a recent and welcome addition to the secular calendar. Catholic saints and theologians have much to offer by way of observance. Take for example, third-century martyr Saint Lawrence, who said, as he was being roasted over hot coals, "I'm well done on this side. Turn me over." Or 16thcentury Carmelite sister Saint Teresa of Ávila, who after a mishap is said to have complained to God, "If this is how you treat your friends, no wonder you have so few of them!" And a final installment for the one-liner celebration, early 20th-century theologian G.K. Chesterton, who wisely noted: "The Bible tells us to love our neighbors, and also to love our enemies; probably because generally they are the same people." Contemplate the truth behind the humor.

#### Wednesday, Jan 22, 2025

#### Love has no boundaries

For many people it is not a priority to find common ground with people of other faiths and to remain in loving and respectful relationships with people of all faiths. That's regrettable because only mutual respect and knowledge of one another's religious values and traditions can get us beyond suspicion of those who are "not like us." Confronted by the needs of others, including sinners, lepers, and those who were seriously ill, Jesus saw beyond the religious restrictions of his ancestors and brought healing, forgiveness, and empowerment at all times. What can you do to more fully open your heart to the suffering of others from different faiths and Christian traditions?

Hebrews 7:1-3, 15-17; Mark 3:1-6 (313). "Is it lawful to do good on the sabbath rather than to do evil?"

#### Thursday, Jan 23, 2025

#### We could use more togetherness

This is Christian Unity Week, a time to remember that the differences among Christians derive from our *interpretations* of the story of Jesus, not the story itself. In truth, we all follow the same Christ. From all of recorded history, it seems, we humans have tried to distinguish ourselves from one another, to be original, unique, distinct. The result is that we end up separating ourselves from one another and somehow forgetting we are all children of God. The story of humanity amounts to: We divide, God unifies. Try rewriting the story of your own life to be more inclusive of others.

Hebrews 7:25-8:6; Mark 3:7-12 (314). "Jesus is always able to save those who approach God through him."

#### Friday, Jan 24, 2025

#### **Embrace your Christian roots**

The gospel writers deliberately emphasized the number 12 when naming the apostles, drawing a connection to the 12 tribes of Israel —a symbol of the new covenant in Christ. Yet, this number was never meant to be fixed. Every Christian is called to spread the gospel. As Jesus instructed his apostles, who once sought to stop others from preaching in his name, "Do not silence them. Whoever is not against us is for us." This is a timely reminder, especially during Christian Unity Week. The faith of every Christian today, regardless of denomination, can ultimately be traced back to those first 12 apostles. Take a moment to recognize the family resemblance in all followers of Jesus.

Hebrews 8:6-13; Mark 3:13-19 (315). "He appointed Twelve, whom he also named Apostles, that ... he might send them forth to preach."

#### Saturday, Jan 25, 2025 An about-face for the ages

Saint Paul is considered the most significant figure in Christian history after Jesus. That is why his conversion is celebrated by the church. His change of heart from Christian persecutor to passionate advocate set the stage for the broad expansion of Christianity and altered the course of salvation history. In his travels and through his letters Paul encouraged and instructed fledgling Christian communities and inspired new ones to form. Paul is an example to all of us of how to become "new creations" in Christ. As Pope Francis explains, "In Paul's case, what changed him was not a mere idea or conviction: it was the encounter with the Risen Lord that transformed his whole being." Take time to read Paul's letters and allow them to reignite your own apostolic zeal.

FEAST OF THE CONVERSION OF PAUL, APOSTLE Acts 22:3-16 or 9:1-22; Mark 16:15-18 (519). "This man is a chosen instrument of mine."
