PARISH MEMBERSHIP: We welcome you into our Parish Families.

Membership in the parish consists of two parts:

Registration: Please fill out form and return to Office.

Participation: As a member of the Church, you are accepting the responsibility of weekly worship as well as supporting God's work here through giving of yourself, your time and talents, and a worthy Sunday offering to show your love for God and your gratitude for His many favors.

RECONCILIATION/CONFESSIONE: One half-hour prior to weekend Mass or by request/appointment.

BAPTISM/BATTESIMO: Preparation is required for the reception of the sacrament. Parents are encouraged to call the Rectory and set up an appointment before the birth of their child.

MATRIMONY/MATRIMONIO: Arrangements should be made at least six or more months in advance. A marriage preparation program is required.

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK/INFERMI: In cases of emergencies, please call anytime. Please notify the Parish Office for Communion calls to the sick, shut-ins. Due to privacy laws, if parishioners wish to be visited in the hospital, they should contact the Parish Office directly and give the information regarding the hospitalization. If you are scheduled for surgeries or other medical procedures, please contact the Parish Office in advance so that a priest can administer Anointing of the Sick prior to the procedure.

ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST

Dear Friends in Christ.

A Reminder.

Frequently, I hear of parishioners being ill or in the hospital after they have recovered or gone home. I'd like you to know that if anyone is seriously ill or hospitalized, I am more than willing to come and give them the Anointing of the Sick. If they are in danger of death, I would administer the **Last Rites**. This is an important part of pastoral ministry, and I am happy to make sure our parishioners have this sacrament available when they are in need.

If a friend or family member would call the office and leave a message with **Aggie**, **Vicky**, or on the voicemail – I would be able to retrieve it. In case of a sacramental emergency, you could call or text my cell number: **716-353-0360**.

The Sacrament of Anointing is rooted in Scripture. In the Fifth Chapter of the Letter of James, it says: "Is there anyone among you sick? He should summon the priests of the Church; they should pray over the sick person and anoint him with oil in the name of the Lord. The prayer of faith will save the sick person, and the Lord will raise him up. If he has committed any sin, he will be forgiven." In addition to the anointing, in danger of death, the priest is given the authority to administer the Apostolic Pardon which is a blessing reserved to the Holy See that forgives all the sins of a person's life as they prepare to face the Lord.

This is available to all of us who are seriously ill, and I invite you to avail yourselves of this sacrament whenever you or someone in your family is in serious difficulty with their health. It's an ancient practice of the **Church** and something that is there for all of us.



The information in scripture on Jesus' childhood is a bit sketchy. At the end of the story of the presentation of the infant Jesus in the temple, we learn that Jesus "grew and became strong, filled with wisdom." When we next hear of him, Jesus is 12 years old, discussing Jewish teachings at the temple, and "astounding" those who hear him. Quite a bit of growth and development obviously transpired in the intervening years! Mary and Joseph are the unsung heroes here, for having nurtured and raised Jesus in such a way that he was ready to fulfill his destiny. How can you continue to grow and develop in *your* faith?

Roll back the stone

Saint Pope John Paul II used the phrase the "culture of death" to describe society's willingness to undermine the value of human life at every turn. Abortion, euthanasia, capital punishment, war, torture, discrimination, exploitative practices in research, and economic injustice are just a few of the many ways we devalue the image of God inherent in each person. Rather than seeking peaceful, life-affirming solutions, living "among the tombs" allows us to embrace violent and inhumane options more readily. Take steps in your own life to roll back the tombstone of indifference and promote life among the living.

Keep in touch with Jesus

Jesus' power to heal transcended that of a mere traveling wonderworker or miracle man. His healing power came from God, and those who were afflicted were restored not just by his divine ability, but through their faith in him as the Son of God. His miracles reveal both his divinity and his humanity, as they often involved a personal, compassionate touch. Healing, like suffering, takes many forms—physical, emotional, and spiritual—and Jesus addresses each with care. In times of need, do not hesitate to turn to him in faith. He will hear you and, with wisdom, offer you the healing touch you seek.

Don't get stuck in a rut

In the gospel, we often see Jesus amazed by the faith of others, crediting their belief as the key to their healing. But there are also moments when Jesus is "amazed"—perhaps dismayed would be the better word—by the lack of faith in those around Him. Narrow thinking, rigid routines, stereotypes, and negative assumptions can all block the miracles of God's love. To experience the fullness of God's power, keep your faith alive and open a path for the Lord to perform mighty deeds.

Unchanging demands and promises

Paul Miki (1562-97) was born into a wealthy Catholic family and received his education from the Jesuits. He grew to be deeply immersed in his own culture, with a profound understanding of Buddhism. After joining the Society of Jesus, he became an effective and compassionate preacher to the Japanese people. Despite the expulsion of his fellow Jesuits from Japan, Paul Miki chose to remain and continued his mission. Ultimately, he was crucified alongside 25 others in Nagasaki. For each generation of Christians, the core demands of faith and the promises of Christ remain unchanged: to love God and one another, and through this love, to experience eternal life.

For our part, we would do well to heed the wisdom found in the Letter to the Hebrews: "Do not neglect hospitality, for through it some have unknowingly entertained angels." Welcome the stranger with love and you may find you've opened the door to the divine.

Almost every Saturday of the year, we're invited to reflect on the example of Mary, the Mother of the Church, whose life reveals the essence of true discipleship.
