MATRIMONY/MATRIMONIO: Arrangements should be made at least six or more months in advance. A marriage preparation program is required.



Your turn at bat

Ever feel overwhelmed in the face of a monumental experience? Many of us have been there, including the prophet Isaiah. Isaiah had known firsthand the glory of God. In the face of such great beauty and goodness, he felt keenly his own imperfections and those of his community. Yet, God accepted Isaiah as he was and at the same time helped transform him so that he felt empowered to step up and volunteer his life. Today is a good time to ask yourself whether you are prepared to step up to the plate and offer your life to God.

FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME Isaiah 6:1-2a, 3-8; 1 Corinthians 15:1-11 or 15:3-8, 11; Luke 5:1-11 (75). "'Here I am,' I said; 'send me!'"

Monday, Feb 10, 2025

Glory be to God!

To ponder our beginnings is always stunning. The Catechism of the Catholic Church notes that scientific studies have enriched our knowledge of the age and dimensions of the cosmos: "These discoveries invite us to even greater admiration for the greatness of the Creator, prompting us to give him thanks for all his works and for the understanding and wisdom he gives to scholars and researchers." The shortest month often feels like the longest in our hemisphere, yet being stopped in our snowy tracks on an ordinary day to become aware of the Creator God is a call to praise.

Get in sync

The 19th-century *Dictionary of Phrase and Fable* defined "lip service" as "verbal devotion; honoring with the lips while the heart takes no part nor lot in the matter." This definition—drawn from centuries of wisdom from biblical times to today—still holds true. Technology may progress and develop, but human nature remains stubbornly the same. The next time you find yourself in worship, whether in a pew, a prayer group, or in your own home, reflect on whether what is on your lips is also in your heart. If not, pray for a more perfect alignment between the two!

Wednesday, Feb 12, 2025

Recommended daily dose

Each year, Americans spend billions on diet programs and regimens, reflecting a deep obsession with controlling food intake. Pop psychologist Dr. Phil suggests that this preoccupation often masks a deeper desire to control something more profound: how we feel about ourselves. Jesus recognized this tendency more than 2,000 years ago, urging people to focus on how their inner attitudes are reflected in their thoughts, words, and actions. As we prioritize healthy eating and balanced nutrition, let's also remember to nourish our souls. Along with wholesome food, let's make time for daily introspection and prayerful contemplation.

Thursday, Feb 13, 2025

Love without borders

Syro-Phoenicians, who were enemies of Israel and didn't share in the same faith, were, in the minds of Jesus' disciples, unworthy of God's help. But Jesus turned that attitude on its head by teaching that all human life has sacred dignity and is beloved by God, even the lives of our enemies. Christians have struggled with this teaching, and at various times in history found it easier to condemn and shun rather than love those who are different. Reflect on those you might find unworthy of God's love and strive to show them compassion.

Genesis 2:18-25; Mark 7:24-30 (332). "Lord, even the dogs under the table eat the children's scraps."

Friday, Feb 14, 2025

Savor wisdom

"Knowledge is power," said Ben Franklin. The serpent said the same thing to Eve, and she bought it. Although knowledge often does give us access to the corridors of power, it doesn't guarantee us wisdom. Wisdom, an attribute of God, is acquired only through the indwelling Holy Spirit. In the Bible, knowledge is imagined sometimes as tantalizing fruit dangling from a forbidden tree. Wisdom, however, sets a lavish table at which her guests may dine by accepting her invitation. When faced with the choice, take the opportunity to savor the meal that lasts to eternity.

Genesis 3:1-8; Mark 7:31-37 (333). "God knows well that the moment you eat of it your eyes will be opened and you will be like gods."

Saturday, Feb 15, 2025

Don't fill up on junk

Some people will always set out food when you visit their homes no matter what time of day it is. If you're smart you learn to drop by when you're good and hungry! Jesus never let anyone walk away hungry either—even if it meant setting the table for 5,000. His mother foretold that fact in her great song, the Magnificat: "He has filled the hungry with good things." When tired of the empty offerings of the world, pray Mary's Magnificat (Luke 1:47-55) in faith that God will fill you with what truly satisfies.
